#### Oral Presentation Guidelines

- Use the preferred [slide template](#) as the event template
- Slides should support your message, not serve as a script
- Each presentation should be 15 minutes, leaving 5 minutes for questions and answers (Aim for one slide every 1.5-2 minutes)
- Keep text minimal and focus on key points
- Use visuals (charts, images) to enhance understanding
- Ensure text is readable from a distance
- Avoid overcrowding slides
- Build a clear and engaging story throughout your presentation

#### Accessibility:

- Describe visuals clearly for all learners
- Use simple, inclusive language

#### Day of Presentation:

##### Arrive on Time

- 15 minutes before the session start time, arrive at your session room to check in with A/V.
- Please bring the most up-to-date version of your PowerPoint on a USB flash drive as a backup.

##### Be a Human."

- Introduce yourself to attendees before you begin the presentation.
- Smile! It is a natural way to warm up your audience and make them feel comfortable.
- Maintain eye contact. The more you engage with attendees, the more effective your content delivery will be.
- Encourage Q&A and/or attendees to follow up with you.

##### Stay Organized.

- Provide overviews/recaps during your presentation.
- Use signal phrases to refocus interest.
- Keep the big picture fresh in the listener's mind; avoid too many details.
- Stay on time, please do not exceed your speaking slot.

##### Boost the Energy!

- Be flexible to changing presentation pace.

- Incorporate an activity for audience participation.
  - Use different tones of voice to emphasize points.
  - Speak loudly and clearly.
  - Respond to questions with enthusiasm and try to tune into the questioner's train of thought.

## Poster Presentation Arrangement and Content Guide

### Instructions for Your Poster Presentation

Clinical Trials Day 2026 is an in-person event, and attendance is required to present your poster.

### Recommended Poster Size

All poster presenters are responsible for printing their poster and bringing it, already mounted on the foam board, to Clinical Trials Day 2026. Tables will be provided for your poster boards.

See the recommended poster sizes below (many people design in Microsoft PowerPoint).

<u>Orientation</u>	<u>Recommended Poster Size</u>	<u>Notes</u>
Portrait panel	24" × 36"	Best fit for the center
Landscape	36" × 24"	Fits well horizontally across the center section
Larger Landscape	40" × 30"	Will extend slightly across folds



### Materials

Poster text may be printed directly onto white paper, lightweight, colored poster paper, or cardboard. A lightweight paper or fabric background may be used to give text printed on white paper visual appeal and contrast.

Be prepared to print any corresponding materials to promote or support your research.

### Printing

Posters must be high-resolution and sized to any of the suggested dimensions above.

Rutgers offers several convenient and cost-effective options for printing your poster through its expanded Print Services Program (PSP), which includes multiple approved vendors and standardized pricing. This program is designed to simplify ordering while ensuring high-quality print materials.

For poster printing, Rutgers libraries provide accessible on-campus options. Dana Library can print posters up to 24" or 36" wide, while Alexander Library supports 36" wide printing. Poster printing is priced at approximately \$5 per square foot, and all posters must be paid for in advance under the current policy. Accepted payment methods vary by location and may include IPO, credit card, or Raider Dollars.

Presenters are encouraged to plan ahead and allow sufficient time for printing and pickup. Additional resources, including poster templates and printing request forms, are available through Rutgers Libraries and the [Rutgers Brand Templates](#) website.

### Presentation Schedule

The Presenting Author must set up their poster on their assigned poster board by **9:45 a.m.**, and at least one representative/colleague is required to attend the poster session. Presenters should also be prepared to stand in front of their poster during the celebration to discuss their research with attendees and remove their poster by the removal deadline. ***This is not a formal oral presentation at the podium.*** There is also no virtual option to present your poster.

### Setup and Takedown

Presentations: All Poster presenters should arrive at 9:45 am to set up their physical poster and take down is immediately following the poster reception.

At the end of the session, please promptly remove your materials and clean out your poster area. Any posters left behind will be discarded.

If you are scheduled to present two posters, we recommend placing a sign on the second poster indicating the specific poster number so they can find you for immediate assistance.
